1. Categories of UO Employees - Unionized and Non-unionized

- <u>Faculty</u>: United Academics, American Association of University Professors/American Federation of Teachers, represents approximately 1,800 out of 2,100 faculty members, with an initial collective bargaining agreement (CBA) ratified in October, 2013.
- <u>Graduate teaching assistants</u>: The Graduate Teaching Fellows Federation, American Federation of Teachers, represents about 1,400 graduate teaching assistants pursuant to a mature CBA. Negotiations for the new GTFF contract are set to begin in Fall, 2013.
- <u>Officers of Administration</u>: Approximately 1,100 Officers of Administration hold a wide range of positions: supervisors, managers, confidential office workers, advisers, counselors and professional academic support. Officers of Administration are not represented by a union.
- <u>Classified employees</u>: Approximately 1,700 classified employees are represented by the Service Employees International Union (SEIU). These employees include custodians, clerical workers, groundskeepers, maintenance personnel, and other support staff. The collective bargaining agreement with the SEIU is negotiated by the Oregon University System, not by the University of Oregon. Ratification of the most recent contract with SEIU is pending as of mid-October, 2013.


2. Expectations of Tenure Track Faculty

- <u>Research</u>: All tenure track faculty are expected to be involved in knowledge production. The CBA with United Academics provides for regular review of the research, creative, and scholarly activities of faculty.
- <u>Teaching</u>: All tenure track faculty teach regular courses, typically at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Students evaluate each class and faculty peers observe and evaluate teaching. The CBA provides for regular review of teaching.
- <u>Service</u>: All tenure track faculty are expected to engage in service at the department, college, university, and professional levels. Service expectations are more modest until tenure-track faculty achieve tenure. Promotion to full professor requires national or international recognition. The CBA provides for regular review of service activities.

3. Recruitment and Retention of Faculty


- Prior to completion of the CBA with United Academics, total compensation for tenure-track and tenured faculty members was approximately six percent below the eight institutions designed by the Oregon University System as UO's peers and approximately nine percent below the public members of the Association of American Universities (AAU). While salaries are generally lower than they should be, retirement programs are substantially more generous than those operated by its peers. Benefits are also generous in comparison with peers.
- While the CBA provides for substantial salary increases, the cost of benefits remains high.
- The University is behind its AAU competitors in the ratio of tenure-track and tenured faculty to non-tenure-track faculty and has a higher student/tenure-track-faculty ratio. The number of tenure-track faculty must increase to catch up with recent enrollment growth.


